COVID-19 UPDATES

The most recent and accurate information about Solano's Covid-19 protocols and regulations can be found on their Coronavirus Homepage at welcome.solano.edu/coronavirus/.

" Students will be required to either get vaccinated, get tested, or take online classes and use online student services exclusively.

- Students who are already fully vaccinated with both shots of either Pfizer or Moderna or the one shot of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine will upload a photo of their vaccination record to Canvas.
- If you are not yet vaccinated, but wish to be before Oct. 15, you have options. You can find free vaccination clinics in the community. See the schedule. Also, most pharmacies and supermarkets now offer walk-in vaccinations.
- If you prefer not to get vaccinated, you must undergo COVID testing twice a week, and upload a negative result for each test to be allowed on campus. The college will offer free testing 5 days a week (M-F), including some evening hours. The PCR test is a non-invasive saliva test that requires you to spit in a cup.
- Employees and volunteers will also be required to be fully vaccinated by October 15th or submit negative COVID test results before coming to campus. For more information, [click here](#).

What is TAP? TAP, Targeted Academic Persistence, is one of many programs offered by the Academic Support Services Department that helps to improve a student's educational journey. TAP is designed to provide support and retention assistance to students experiencing academic difficulties.

When should I contact TAP?

- **When my GPA falls below 2.0**
- **When I'm placed on academic probation**
- **When I haven't completed 50% of attempted units**

Step 3: Make arrangements for an ID photo by emailing the Cashier's Office OR sending the Cashier's Office a picture ID* in .jpg format.

Step 4: Use your SCC ID for free transit on Fast, CityCoach, SolTrans, or SolanoExpress.
