Cheryl McDonald gave an update of the Cosmetology Department and announced that she is celebrating 40 years with the District on September 1st. In addition, the Cosmetology Program has reconfigured the curriculum, expediting when students graduate.

(b) <u>Academic Senate</u>

Michael Wyly gave the following report:

Since my last report to the Trustees, the SCC Academic Senate has met three times, on 8.29, 9. 12 and 9.19.

In my last report, I shared with the Board the Senate's goals of working with its subcommittees to reorient all our committees to understand key areas of senate purview as well as best practices to assure Brown Act compliance. Since that time, I have had occasion to work with all of our committees in this regard, to include Curriculum, Distance Education, Assessment, Basic Skills and Academic Program Review and Professional Development/Flex-Cal. The senate is grateful to these committees and their respective chairs for working with us to facilitate this needed orientation.

Over the course of the last three meetings, one principal focus has been the review of existing and new language for board policies and administrative procedures both as part of a regular review as well as to assure compliance with recommendations by the Community College League. To date, the senate has worked closely with Academic Affairs in our review of over two dozen BP/APs forwarded to the senate by academic affairs. As we take action to approve, the senate will forward its recommendations to the Office of the S-P for review of her office as well as CGC, where appropriate, before being forwarded to the BoT subcommittee for further review. The timeline/schedule before the senate was set at our last meeting of CGC, and I expect that the senate will meet this desired timeline as asked.

In addition, on 9.12, the senate took action to approve a survey to be delivered to our part-time faculty colleagues. As I shared in my last report, another priority of the senate for this academic year is to address proactively issues of equity for our part-time faculty. To best understand what specific goals we might set for this academic year, we will solicit input for our review.

On 9.19, the senate took action to affirm a change in committee structure for the Professional Development subcommittee. Under the leadership of senate VP LaNae Jaimez, this change conforms to on-going conversations between the senate and the office of the S-P to develop a more cohesive and responsive planning structure to empower further professional development opportunities for faculty as well as to benefit all of the College community.

The senate is also excited to announce a new speaker series to highlight sabbatical presentations past and present for the whole of the College. Please look to your emails for dates, presenters and times. We hope to have as many of the college community who may attend to be present.

Finally, the senate continues to work with human resources to develop a Hiring Manual which details SCC's hiring processes for the campus community. I would like to thank Janene Whitesell and Terri Pearson-Bloom for their work and early leadership on this front as well as HR and the leadership and tutelage of Mary Jones.

Before I conclude my report, I would also like to thank, on behalf of the senate, Leslie Minor for her work with faculty during her tenure as VPAA. We are appreciative of all that we were able to accomplish together. And, we look forward to working with Dr. Minor in her new capacity at Solano.

Superintendent-President Esposito-Noy reported that College Governance Council is working on gathering all the board policies for review and revision. Board policies and procedures are being reviewed and revised by a consultant. Once completed, board policies will be brought to the Board as part of the accreditation process.

Jeanne and Ferdinanda, along with SCC student **Susan DeHaven**, helped children as well as adults decorate and paint the prints. This was a great outreach activity to the Vallejo Community.
