Jacob Hinkle gave the following report:

- We had seven senators, including myself, and two associates from the ASSC attended General Assembly this semester as well as our advisor Dr. Slade. We helped pass resolutions that positively affect community college students throughout California along with attending workshops such as event planning, political activism, beginners Robert's Rules and Brown Act, and many more. Everyone that attended had lots of fun and we networked with other associated student organizations.
- We are working on our General Assembly report to present to you so we can give you a more detailed report on what happened at General Assembly. It will be presented to you this June.
- The ASSC Election is finished and the election results have been ratified by the ASSC and will be presented to you [the Governing Board] in June.
- We are also planning to present our end of the year report to you at the end of June since we were unable to get on the agenda due to time constraints.
- One accomplishment I would like to mention is that this is the first time that our Senate has filled every Executive Board and Senate position and have associates for over half of the Senate positions.
- The Senate has been working tirelessly to revise our bylaws to make them clearer, concise, and add information that would increase our ability to be an even more

organized governing body to better serve the students. We will present them in June as well.

(b) <u>Academic Senate</u>

Michael Wyly gave the following report:

Since my last report, the Academic Senate has met on three occasions, two regular meetings of the senate and one special meeting dedicated to its first read of the accreditation self-study. At its meeting on May 1, the senate took action to approve the Faculty Hiring Manual, to inform Administrative Procedures on the hiring of faculty at Solano Community College and composed in collaboration with Human Resources and the Office of the S-P. This manual represents a significant undertaking wherein the senate and HR were able to create a more robust and informative document to assure compliance, equity and fairness in all hires at SCC, including FT, PT and Emergency Hires. It is a significant document, and my thanks to Terri Pearson-Bloom and Janene Whitesell, the two senators who served with me on the taskforce to create the initial drafts of this document, as well as the members of this AY's senate for its careful attention and vetting.

I am also proud to announce to the Board of Trustees the awardees of this year's Distinguished Faculty Award. Our FT awardee is ESL faculty member, Melissa Reeve. And our PT awardee is Biotech faculty member, Francis Farahnak. These awardees will be presented their awards at this year's commencement, and we are excited for Professor Reeve to deliver remarks to the graduating student on behalf of our faculty.

At its meeting on May 15, the senate took action to approve Administrative Procedures for HS articulation composed in cooperation with our VPAA and Curriculum Committee Chair as part of the College's efforts to develop more robust and comprehensive procedures for Academic Affairs.

We also approved the new Assessment Handbook, and here I would like to acknowledge the work of Amy Obegi and the Assessment Committee for its diligent and important work on this front.
