Wednesday, February 21, 2018

1. CALL TO ORDER

A Regular Meeting of the Solano Community College District Governing Board was called to order at 6:30 p.m., on Wednesday, February 21, 2018, in the Denis Honeychurch Board Room, Room 626, 4000 Suisun Valley Road, Fairfield, California 94534, by Board Vice President Young.

At this time, Board Vice President Young made the following dedication and called for a moment of silence:

On behalf of the trustees of Solano Community College District, I dedicate the February 21, 2018 Board Meeting in memory of the 17 individuals who were killed on February 14, 2018 in the tragic mass shooting at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida. Also, 15 people were wounded when a former student entered the school and opened fire with an AR-15 style rifle.

(a) Associated Students of Solano College (ASSC)

The ASSC has undertaken many wonderful events during this spring semester. The first event of the semester was Welcome Back Week, which saw involvement from any different campusbased organizations. The ASSC also hosted Club Promo Day which is a day for the campus clubs to mingle, network, and perform membership outreach. Overall, Welcome Back Week was a huge success sand it was wonderful to see the Solano College community come together.

The ASSC hosted many Black History Month events including a speech from Dr. Tommie C. Smith, a panel discussion including Jesse Branch, Sgt. Major, USMC, Retired, and James Harris, Chief MSgt., USAF, Retired; a showing of a movie titled "For Love of Liberty, the Story of American Black Patriots"; and a genealogy workshop entitled "Find Your Roots".

It was wonderful to see the support and interest the student body showed in honoring the sacrifices made by African Americans in celebration of Black History Month.

(b) <u>Academic Senate</u>

The Senate has met twice since the last report and the next meeting is scheduled for February 26th. Senate action taken during the last two meetings include: recommended edits to the procedures for Board Policy 4005, simply asking that the procedure point to the hiring handbook; and proposing changes to the Senate constitution.

The Senate is actively soliciting for president, vice president, one senator at-large position, and one adjunct at-large position to serve for the 2018-2020 terms.

On behalf of the Senate, Professor Wyly thanked VP Robert Diamond for attending the Academic Senate meeting and presenting the budget report.

In addition to action items, the Senate has some priorities which include reviewing the recommendations from ACCJC from the accreditation report. The Senate also continues to focus on guided pathways in cooperation with VP David Williams and the Guided Pathways task force.

As Senate President, Professor Wyly expressed his dismay for the shootings in Parkland, Florida, and has reached out to student government in a letter of support.

(c) <u>College Governance Council</u>

Superintendent-President Esposito-Noy reported that board policies are being reviewed by College Governance Council and a new set of policies will be submitted for review next week at the meeting.

Dr. Esposito-Noy commended Professor Michael Wyly, VP David Williams and others who have led conversations regarding guided pathways which were very robust.

(d) <u>Superintendent-President</u>

There was a very good turnout for speaker Dr. Tommie Smith with about 300 people in attendance. Dr. Smith spent time signing books and teachers, and taking pictures with attendees. It was a very good opportunity for those in attendance to learn that protest in sports has been around for quite some time.

The CBOC meeting was held yesterday, February 20th, where the 2015-2016 annual report was approved. The Chair will be bringing that report to the Board at the March 7, 2018 meeting.
