The Board is asked to approve this contract Amendment #1 with Pacific Dining – Food Service Management for the District's cafeteria service provider. Attached is a copy of the contract amendment #1 for the Board's review.

This Amendment to the Food Services Agreement is made at Fairfield, California on April 16, 2020, by and between the Solano Community College District ("District") and Pacific Dining – Food Service Management ("Provider").

RECITALS

- 1. District and Provider entered into the original Food Services Agreement on March 25, 2019; and
- 2. The term of the current Food Services Agreement is a one-year term with additional four (4) one-year annual terms which expires on March 24, 2020; and
- 3. With mutual consent and agreement between District and Provider, the District may exercise its option to extend the Food Services Agreement by one (1) additional year to expire on March 24, 2021 with the following conditions;
 - A. A 6% monthly commission on Cafeteria and Catering sales (gross sales less sales tax) shall be changed to sharing the net profit of 20% District and 80% Provider. The net profit shall be calculated as sales/income less expenses (sales tax, direct labor with no overhead, cost of goods sold, insurance, license and permit, scholarships, and contributions); and
 - B. Provide two annual scholarships contribution of \$250 each, two annual contributions of goods and services of \$250 for the Associated Student Body Government, and \$500 for the Superintendent-President Administration; which will be an expense against the net profit; and

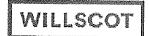
