Dear members of the Board of Solano Community College,

This letter addresses the need to reconsider the proposed layoff notifications directed at the Science Laboratory Technicians. Given that this will be the eighth week of the Governor's shelter at home order, Summer 2020 will be a critical time for the Vacaville Science Laboratory Technician to work diligently to support instructional continuity regardless of the modality moving forward in this uncertain time. *Science Laboratory Technicians are a critical component of science instruction whether it be virtual or onsite*. We are able to work onsite and support instructors while observing all mandatory social distancing requirements. Now is not the time to initiate layoffs. Rather an all-hands-on-deck approach for all the Science Laboratory Technicians would better support the college's ability to remain a competitive and viable choice for higher education. The race is on for having a viable business model for instruction come Fall 2020 and here forward. This dedicated group of the Vacaville Science Laboratory Technicians are ready and willing to work collaboratively and effectively towards this goal. A reduction of work hours for this group would place SCC at a serious disadvantage.

We need to accomplish the following tasks:

- Support virtual laboratory demonstrations as needed
- Sanitize all student use laboratory equipment for example:
 - o Biology and Biotechnology in Vacaville has 170+ microscopes
 - o Biology, Biotech, and Chemistry have hundreds of models & pieces of equipment
- Collaborate with custodians on developing a sanitary lab program (i.e. wipes, cleaners)
- Work with instructors to develop sanitary equipment use protocols for students
- Work on a student/equipment tracking program (in case of an infected student)
- Guidelines for PPE supplying/wearing for Faculty, Staff and Students
- Guidelines for lab room occupancy protocols (i.e. entry/exit, duration in lab)
- Consult with the Public Health Department for safe laboratory practice protocols

We need to approach these issues with progressive actions. It is imperative to start planning now to avoid jeopardizing the safety of our students, faculty and staff.

Thank you for understanding the need to keep us working for the safety of Solano Community College students.

Charlie Solt, Local 39 Representative, requested the following e-mail sent to Mary Jones and Salvatore Abbate be read as public comment:

Sal, thank you for arranging the ZOOM mtg today to discuss the "Reduction in work assignment: notification. Local 39 requests to meet and confer with the college regarding this decision as well as the impact on Local 39 members impacted by this decision. That being said, Local 39 is extremely concerned that the restrictions placed on all of us during this COVID pandemic significantly impair Local 39 and Solano College ability to conduct and complete the meet and confer process in a thorough and timely fashion. Our ZOOM meeting today was evidence of the challenges we face. Additionally the Union is disadvantaged because we do not have readily access to our members and cannot meet do to social distancing and stay at home orders. In fact, the Union offices are closed which makes creating and retrieving documents even more difficult and time consuming. The impact of the Districts proposal is inconsequential to the District, but devastating to our members (District employees). The Union would like to discuss the possibility of postponing the implementation of the Reduction in Work assignment until the 2021 school year. I understand this is an unusual if not extraordinary request, but these are unusual and extraordinary times. An extension of the implementation would allow the parties to meet and confer in person and complete the process in a traditional fashion. There is no indication from the notice that this situation is an emergency that the District just became aware of and has to implement in thirty days. More time would allow the impacted employees twelve months to prepare for an inevitable substantial compensation reduction as opposed to the terms proposed in the notice. Solano College has been very accommodating to the Local 39 membership during this pandemic, and Local 39 deeply appreciates that. In the interim Local 39 will prepare an information request in the event the District decides the necessity of the change outweighs the concerns expressed.

Faculty and staff from the School of Liberal Arts submitted the following in honor of Margaret Abel-Quintero:

Margaret Abel-Quintero retires this spring after almost 25 years of teaching Spanish at Solano College. It's astonishing to learn that she started her teaching career 40 years ago. Margaret is passionate about foreign language acquisition, committed to using multiple modalities in the classroom, and during her tenure here has taught thousands of Solano students. In addition to introductory and advanced courses in Spanish, she has taught Spanish conversation classes, classes on Spanish-language cultures and cinema, and Spanish for medical workers. She especially enjoyed hosting, along with her colleagues, the annual Foreign Language night, which showcased Solano students singing and dancing to traditional folk music as well as performing skits and poetry. In recent years she spearheaded an effort to adopt new, more accessible curriculum for Spanish classes.

Born in Iowa, Margaret—or Peggy, as she is called by family—grew up in the Midwest as one of six siblings. She attended the University of Iowa for her B.A. in Spanish, then earned her master's in Hispanic Languages and Literature and her Ph.D. in Portuguese Literature, with her dissertation "Eça Beyond Realism: A Study of the Language of Flowers in *Os Maias*," from the University of California at Santa Barbara. In addition to Spanish, she is fluent in Portuguese and has traveled to Portugal many times.

As a teacher, Margaret is known for her high energy and spontaneity in the classroom, caring nature, and her willingness to go the extra mile for her students, who year in and out could be seen lining up outside her office door, waiting for their turn to work with her one-on-one. As a colleague, she is thoughtful and generous. Division meetings were enhanced by her cheerful enthusiasm and her signature enchiladas were always a hit at our school potlucks. In sum, Margaret has made a deep and lasting impression on the School of Liberal Arts and the Solano College community, and we will never forget her.
